

Recipe Of The Month....

Delicious Chocolate Cake

2 C sugar

1 ¾ C flour

34 C Hershey's cocoa

1 ½ tsp baking powder

1 ½ tsp baking soda

1 tsp salt

2 eggs

1 C whole milk

½ C vegetable oil

2 tsp vanilla extract

1 C boiling water

- ✓ Makes 7 cups batter
- ✓ Preheat over to 350 degrees
- ✓ Prepare pan(s) with either shortening and flour or Wilton Cake Release
- ✓ Using a large mixing bowl, stir together sugar, flour, cocoa, baking powder, baking soda and salt
- ✓ Add eggs, milk, oil and vanilla
- ✓ Beat on medium for 2 minutes, scraping sides and bottom of bowl occasionally
- ✓ Stir in boiling water with a spatula until well incorporated
- ✓ Pour batter into pan(s) and bake for 35 minutes (depending on pan size) or when a toothpick inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean
- ✓ Do not open oven while cake is baking or cake will fall
- ✓ Set pan on cooling rack for 15 minutes before removing cake from pan
- ✓ Allow to cool completely before frosting

Matrix!!!

Guess what happened on the way to Outback Steak House.....

I love to tell the story of how Matrix came into our lives because it was such a good thing all the way around.

It was a nice August Saturday, and I had talked my husband Rob into getting up early to do some shopping with me. I'm not a big shopper myself, but we needed things for the house and he's rarely off on Saturdays (he's a letter carrier), so we got up early and went shopping. We shopped all day long and decided that perhaps we would go out for an early dinner.

Since we were at the Concord Mall in Delaware, we decided to scoot down 202 to the Outback Steak House. As we travelled down 202, we came to a red light and found ourselves right next to Pet Kraze. The sign read "Husky Rescue Today". Having rescued a Husky (Storm) two years earlier, I said to my husband, "Let's take a look".

We had talked about getting another Husky. Having Storm and our daughter's Dachshund, Dodger, made it difficult. Storm had been abused and Dodger is a little dog, with a big dog attitude, but still a little dog. Because Storm was abused, her personality/feelings would have to be considered before any animal joined our pack. She's my baby and we came a long way earning her trust. So my husband Rob, voice of reason, said "Ok, but we are just looking; we are not ready for another dog just yet." I said ok and was ready to "just look".

So we pulled into the parking area and proceeded into the store. There we were greeted by three dogs, Kaia, Takoda and Matrix. Matrix a beautiful blue eyed black and white husky, I thought oh god, he looks just like my Storm. Ok, her hair is longer where his was shorter, but the markings and eyes were the same and to my astonished eyes, they shared the same BIG ears. But my husband said we were just looking, so I tried not to get too excited.



Rob and I never made it past the front door area, as we took it all in. We asked about the rescue, the dogs and most of all Matrix's story. We shared our story of Storm and talked about Dodger, but always kept coming back to Mr. Matrix. He was such a handsome and well behaved boy. He had kisses and love for everyone there. He was patient and even when another dog came into the store, he greeted the dog, and then laid down and let the other dog do his thing even though you could tell he wanted to play. The bigger dog was just not into playing. I couldn't keep my eyes off of Matrix.

Then, the next thing I know, Rob said to me "Ya know Vic, Matrix seems to have a calm personality, I think he might be a fit for Storm." I turned to Kelly, Matrix's foster mom, and said "and he told ME we were just gonna look".

Rob started asking all kinds of questions about Matrix, from his temperament to how he was with other dogs especially smaller ones. Then, much to my surprise Rob asked Kelly how long they were going to be there, because he wanted to bring Storm up to see how they would get along. I was stunned, but you know, there was just something about Matrix.....Kelly asked how long it would take and then offered to stay so we could bring Storm back. Not that I wanted to get my hopes up, but I couldn't help but get excited.

On the way to get Storm, Rob ran through the pros and cons of getting Matrix. Much to my surprise, Mr. "now is not the right time", seemed to be talking himself into getting Matrix. I was of a mind to just encourage him. Our biggest obstacle would be Miss Storm.

So we picked up Storm, and got back to the store in record time. We came back and Chuckie had joined Matrix and Kelly. When we brought in Storm I remember Kelly saying "Wow, look at how big her ears are". Then she greeted Storm and we let the dogs greet each other ~ and you know what.....there didn't seem to be any issues. Storm is not dominant or social, and Matrix is not dominant but is social. He seems to pick up when Storm had enough of trying the social thing and left her to herself. I couldn't have been happier with Storm's whole reaction, no growls, no shyness or hiding. Could this be the match we were looking for???

I looked at Rob and he nodded and then we asked Kelly how we would go about adopting Matrix. After we found out what we needed to know about the adoption process (which was different than when we got Storm), we left.

On the way home I chatted away about Matrix and how well I thought the greeting went. Rob was quiet.....when we got Storm, we met her and took her home. Rob was disappointed not to be taking Matrix home with us. As soon as we got home we went to the website and with Rob over my shoulder, we filled out our application.

Kelly emailed us later to let us know the application was received and would be processed. It was the longest wait of our lives.....while the application was accepted there was still some concern about Dodger, being a small dog and how Storm would be in her own home, so we set up a home visit. All the time I was hoping things would work out.

The day of the home visit came, and I swear Storm and Dodger could tell something was up. Kelly and Matrix showed up and the butterflies were flying a mile a minute in my stomach. The home visit went well and so the adoption was completed. Matrix was now a member of the Ward Pack!! Woo Woo!! We were all elated. Even Storm, who while not social, is now such a breed snob that she let's Matrix curl up beside her and touch her, while poor Dodger doesn't even get to do that. Matrix and Dodger, well the puppy play was rough at first but in the end, Dodger our "Pitbull" in a Dachshund's body, puts him in his place and when he gets too rough he chases Matrix around the house. They are so much like brothers and sister it's just too funny.

We are proud of our Matrix. We took him to obedience class where he learned quickly how to suck up to the teacher and excelled at learning his commands. Everyone fell in love with him and couldn't believe he was a rescue. He even became the teacher's pet, no pun intended. Storm even went to his graduation (top of the class) to give her sibe vibe to her brother. She even seemed proud of him herself.

Matrix is very much a part of our lives, and we can't imagine our family without him. Everyone I know knows about Matrix and MaPaw. I check the website regularly as I know when it's time for the Ward Pack to grow we will be looking there. I still keep in touch with Kelly, Matrix's foster mom, and send her updates/pictures as often as I can. She is a wonderful person and did so well with Matrix that I don't mind including her in his life, she well deserves it.

Oh yeah, and by the way, we still haven't made it to the Outback Steak House. Vicky






